Message from Pastor Tom

Ah, October. The time of year when the weather gets a bite into it, when the leaves change color, when children get ready for Halloween ... and stewardship. Stewardship? In October?

In the past, we have held our Dedication Sunday on the second Sunday of November. But the folks on our Stewardship Committee wanted to do things differently this year, and not just for the sake of doing something different. There was a sense that bringing our commitments for the year ahead in mid-November didn't give us much time to plan out our budget in time for the congregational meeting in late January. Because we have very good and dedicated people, we did the work but it was always a rush. This year, we wanted to give ourselves more time to bring in our commitments and plan for the year ahead.

Our Stewardship Committee discovered that different churches do this at different times of the year, but mostly in the fall. One church did their Stewardship campaign during the season of Lent, to better highlight the giving of our gifts in the light of God's great gift to us. It was also a reminder of the costly grace we have received, and that, as Dietrich Bonhoefer wrote, "What cost God much cannot be cheap for us."

But stewardship is not making our contributions out of our guilt and deep shame. It is the free giving of our gifts to God in joy and thanksgiving. It is saying, "I have been given so much by your love, O Lord, and you have given me the opportunity

to give back. This is how much I love you and how much I thank you."

Stewardship season, of course, is also a time to remember that our giving does not end at the collection plate. It is important to give our financial contributions so that the ministry of the church goes on. It is equally important to give our gifts of time and talent; to teach a class, to engage in a mission activity, to work with others on a committee, to start up or be a part of a small group. There are many ways to serve. There are many ways to say thank you.

One of the things I learned back in seminary was "The Eight Stages of Man" by the noted child psychiatrist Erik Erickson. The next-to last stage of life, the one I am in now, was the one marked by the struggle between generativity – that is, sharing what we have and what we know with those who are younger – and self-absorption. There is always that temptation to keep to one's self, to keep everything close by. In these days filled with concerns about finances because of the mortgage crisis, it can be easy to fall into that temptation, to keep everything close by.

But God has not created us to hold tight. We have been created to let go; to share with others – not just our money, but our time and our abilities. It is when we can let go of the hold possessions have on us and let the love of God flow through us that we are most alive.

Blessings to you all in October, this time of reflecting on our call to be good and faithful stewards.

This month, from October 18 – 25, members of our church and others will be going on the mission to Esteli, Nicaragua. Nicaragua is located in Central America between Honduras and Costa Rica and is the second poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. The country has a very young population with 65% under the age of 25. The unemployment rate is approximately 60% and 48% of the population lives below the poverty level. Most people live in very modest “homes” with dirt floors, tin roofs and walls made of wooden slats. Nicaraguans are loving and spiritual and welcome any assistance that we can provide to them, giving the mission team and those who support it the opportunity to serve God in a special way. In return, their love for God and gratefulness for the few basic material items that they have inspire and teach us.

Kathy Leopold, Dave Littell, Janet Maurer, Felice & Kris Maiorca, Carol Nussle, and Nicholas Yoda are the ALPC members going on the mission. They will be commissioned at church services on October 7. Please remember this group and all of the others going on the trip in your prayers that their work will be a blessing.

Thank you for your amazing generosity at our fundraiser Steak By The Lake and the brick sales. The money raised, will be used specifically for building costs and supplies for the Nicaraguans. Please save the date of **Sunday November 18 from 6:00 – 7:30** for cake, refreshments, and a program to be presented by the mission team to share their experiences.

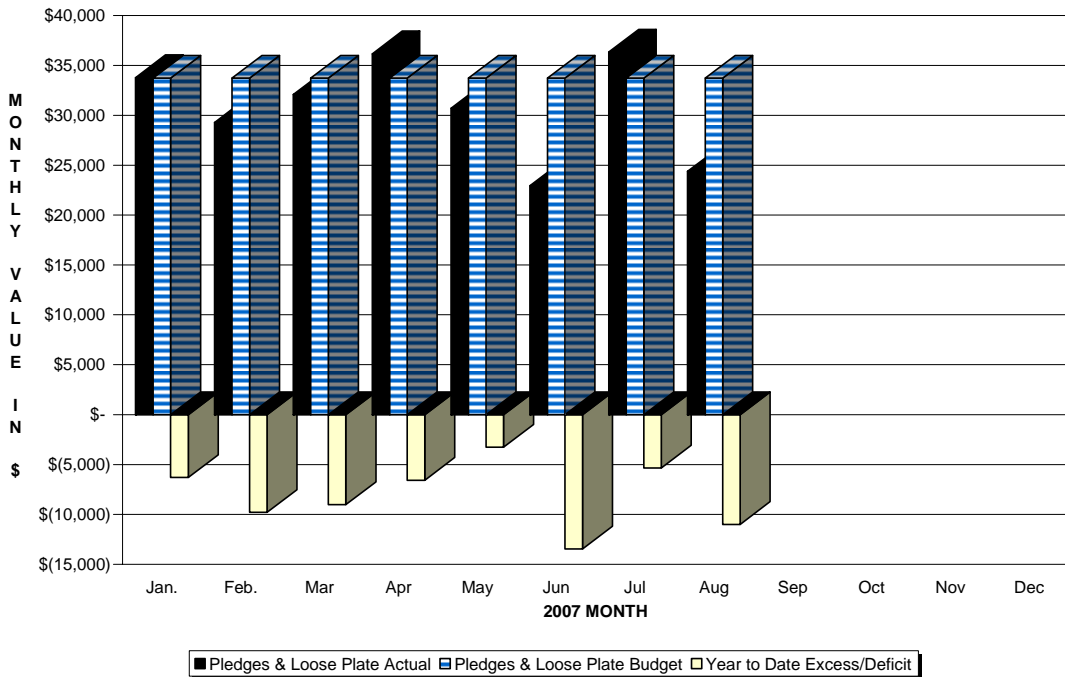

Missionary for The Day

His childhood vision of the work of a missionary was not something he aspired to become. Working on a dark continent, without the comforts of white sheets, three square meals, and a radio, did not seem attractive.

Sitting at the feet of white-haired Mrs. Y in the boiler room of Bay Methodist Church, he heard stories of the good works and hard lives of the men (he heard little if anything of the women) who worked in faraway lands tending to the poor and hungry, and teaching them the same stories of Jesus that he had heard.

Years later, he got more information and gained more respect for those faithful servants that take on the role of missionaries on behalf of Christ. He later decided to become one.

First, he became a doctor in the United States Navy. Subsequently he went into private practice as an internist. Now retired, he volunteers his time and his skill to a group of like-minded doctors in the Pacific Northwest who travel together to provide urgent medical care to victims of earthquakes and tsunamis in the world's poorest countries.

Dr. Bill hasn't the official credentials, certificate, or diploma that tells folks he's a missionary. However, those he treats and cares for know he is one.

Avon Lake PC has its share of missionaries. They are the dozens, if not hundreds of folks who use their time, talent, treasure in service to others as they represent Christ.

The Alternative Holiday Market is a great place to see this annual gathering of missionaries: our members and friends who serve others through the acquisition of alternative gifts for loved ones.*

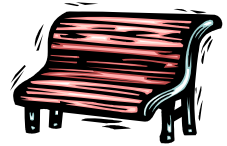

Due to the lateness in the year and the looming holiday season surrounding prior commitment responses, it was often well into January before a clear picture of congregational support for the plan was known. Often, the budget needed to be hastily revised to more properly match committed support. The move to an earlier time should provide the basis for a timelier and more thoroughly prepared budget.

Also, the pledge cards you will receive this year have been redesigned, as the Stewardship Committee continually tries to improve the manner in which you communicate your pledges of overall Stewardship support for our Christian community. The pledge cards will be in the mail to you by October 3rd.

All the Women of the Bible – This classic tells the stories of ALL the women in the Bible, both named and unnamed. Some we have lots to read about, and some have only a sentence.

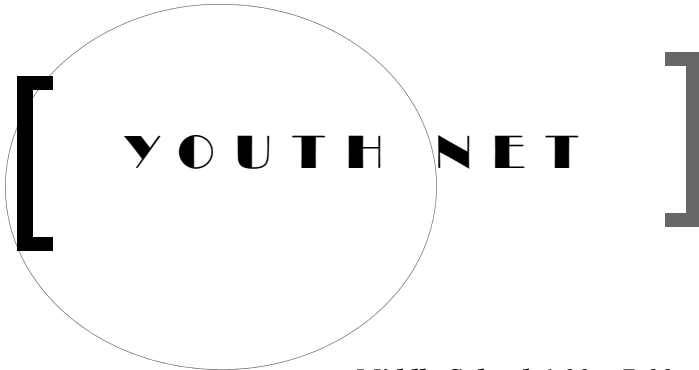
Evidence that Demands a Verdict – If you're interested in seeking proofs of the truth of Christianity, this book is for you.

These hauntingly hungry goblins are dying to get their claws on your leftover Halloween candy!

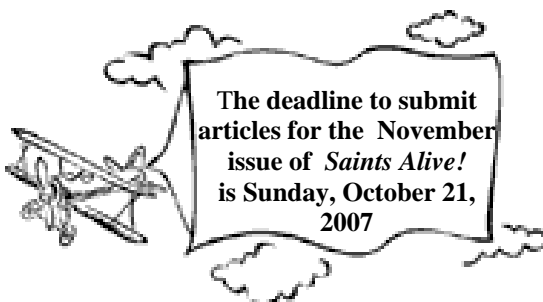
