Message from Pastor Tom

I write a lot about transitions in this piece. January is a transition, with one year following the next; September is a transition with a new school year starting; and now June marks another transition, as the vacation season begins.

Transitions are marked by peril and by opportunity. They are times of change, and times of change are stressful. I still remember when I graduated from college, with no job in hand. Seeing all my friends leave after graduation with their life's work calling them and knowing I wouldn't see them again in the fall, was a feeling of loneliness that I can still feel almost forty years later.

For those of us in the church we have some of those feelings, as folks move out of the area, as our young people get jobs in other places and start their lives over. But for most of us, this is a time for vacation, a time to say, "see you again in late August."

We know how this works. It's always been that way in the church – people leave for weeks or months on end. It's a tradition that the leaders in the church mark as well. It is the season when our worship attendance and financial giving takes a serious dip, and we struggle to keep our financial heads above water until the crowds come back.

We know it's coming, but that doesn't ease the sense of anxiety. We still carry on with worship here; in fact some of us look forward to the summer time as a season to do different things (like Intinction during

Communion, with the option of wine as well as grape juice), or a time to engage in some planning for the future, an activity which our normally busy times preclude.

But we also have concerns for the decrease in financial support that goes with this time of year. Bills still have to be paid, staff still needs to be compensated for, mission outreach still needs support. The general work of the church stills needs to keep moving. The ministry of Jesus Christ does not take a vacation.

So we need your presence in worship, and your participation in the financial support of the church, especially in the summer.

But like I said, this is not just a season of peril. This is also a season of opportunity. The opportunity begins in early June with our Vacation Bible School, being coordinated by new member and Christian Education Director, Carolyn Dzuro. This will be a special time for children and adults alike to hear the stories of Scripture, and to enter those stories with energy, intelligence, imagination and love.

The opportunity also exists for us to read that book that we have been too busy to enjoy. If that is your 'thing,' let me just suggest some picks of mine (with an extra from Nick) – anything by Annie LaMotte (though you should be warned that she can be a bit spicy around her theology); *Blue Like Jazz* by Donald Miller, which has some of LaMotte's flavor; *Christianity for the Rest of Us* by Diana Butler Bass about churches that have experienced new life; *Everything Must Change* by Brian McLaren, part of his ongoing look at how the church needs to

adjust; *Eat, Pray, Love* by Elizabeth Gilbert, some wonderful reflections about faith ‘on the way’; and *Three Cups of Tea* by Greg Mortenson, a mountain climber who built schools in poor mountain communities based on the culture’s theory that when you have three cups of tea with someone, they become like family.

Just some suggestions – in addition to all of the good novels that are out there. Have a wonderful summer!

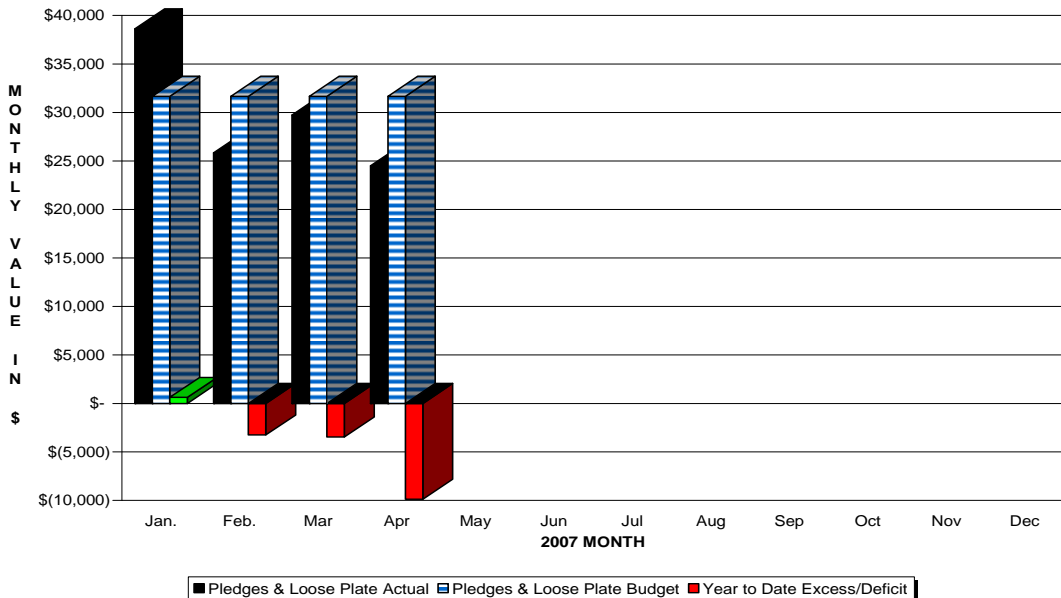
Financial Report

April was not a good month. Our deficit grew to \$9,877. This is a slide of over \$6,000 from our position at the end of March. The reason for the deficit growth was a severe decline in our pledged giving. We went from being slightly ahead of the budget in March to over \$6,000 behind in April. As you can see from the graph below it is our lowest month for giving so far this year. With summer coming up please catch up on your giving if you are behind.

I was looking at some statistics for our entire denomination. The average contribution per member for the entire Presbyterian denomination was \$1,041 in 2006 (the latest statistics available). Our church's average contribution was \$679. This is a rather interesting statistic given that we certainly live in an area of above average income. If you take our total giving and divide it by our average attendance at church versus our entire membership we come closer to the denomination average of \$2,019 with ours being \$1,947. We have been richly blessed as individuals and as a congregation. Maybe we all need to prayerfully consider our response to all our blessings.

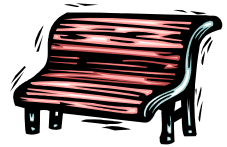

"One, they don't like me, and two, I don't like them."

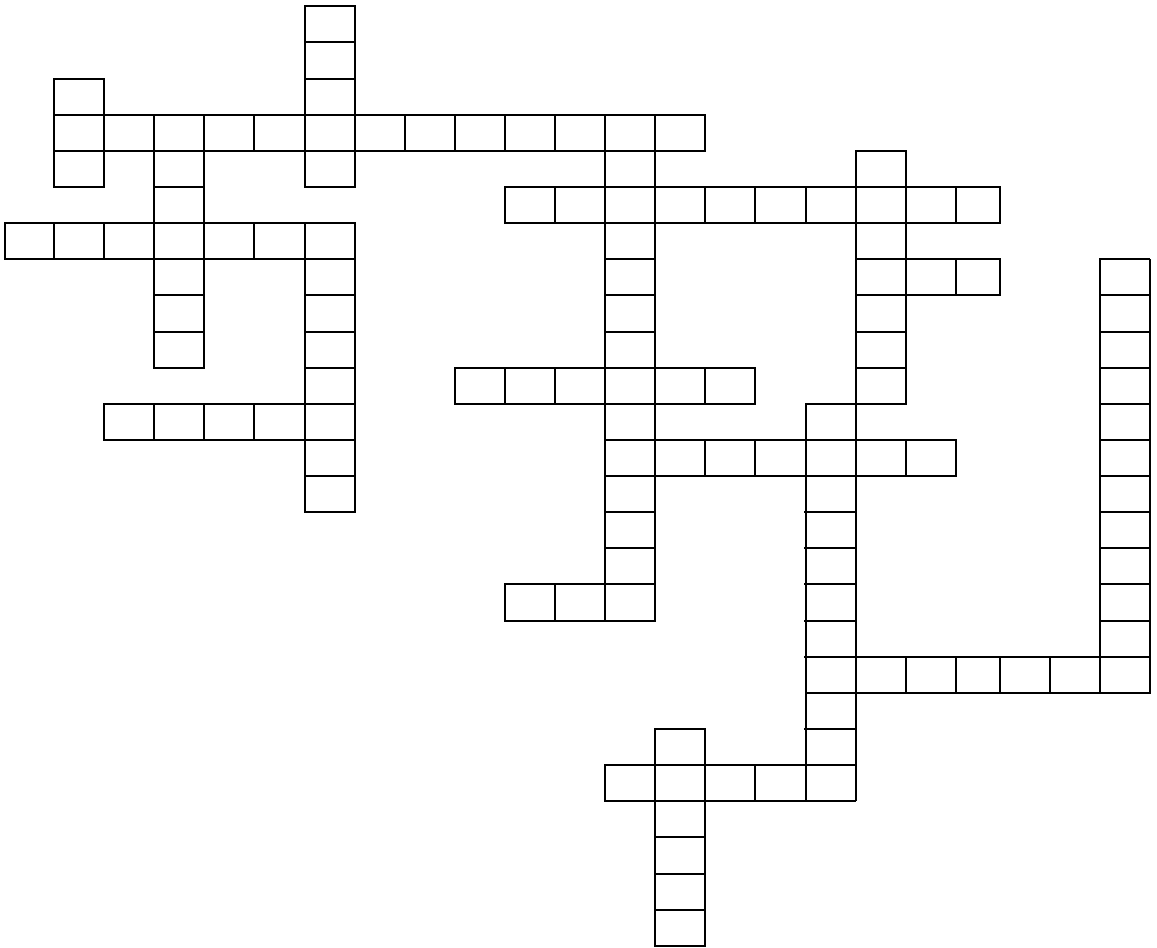

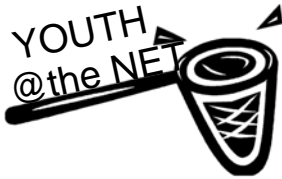

Sign up forms are on the VBS table in the foyer or in the church office.

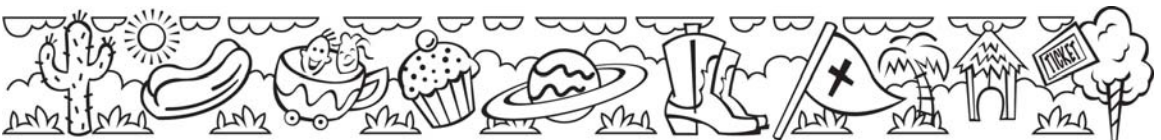

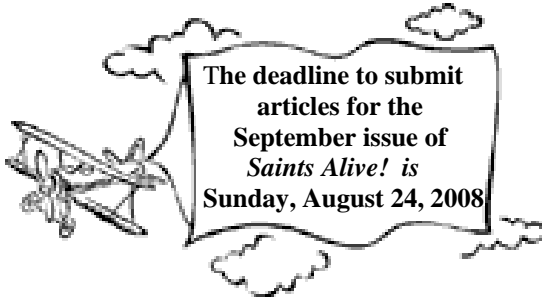
