On the first Sunday of Lent, the service opens with five purple candles and one pink “joy” candle (and the Christ candle) lit. Following the reading, a candle is snuffed out. An additional candle is snuffed out each Sunday of Lent until on Maundy Thursday, only the Christ candle remains lit.

Message from Pastor Tom

By the time you read this, Ash Wednesday will have taken place and Lent will have begun. Lent is from the Old English word meaning “spring,” though around here we know that is relative. When we do get spring around here it usually isn’t during March.

But we do have the six weeks of Lent, marked this year by a new Lenten Wreath, crafted by Sandi Ciarrone. We use the lighting of candles to mark the opening season of the Christian year, the season of Advent. During Lent, we will go in the other direction: Candles will already be lit, and every week, after a series of readings that will serve to call us to worship, they will be extinguished, one by one, until the Christ candle in the middle is extinguished on Maundy Thursday evening.

When Sandi was putting this wreath together, I mentioned that it needed to be gnarled and spiky, like the crown of thorns Jesus wore. She did that and then some, purchasing a genuine crown of thorns, made in the Holy Land, that will make up a part of this wreath.

The purpose of this is to remind us of God’s love which knows no barriers, not even the barriers of our own hostility and violence. The lights go out one by one through the season, but God’s love in Christ burns brightly toward us, even on Maundy Thursday. We know that Easter will come, with the return of the lit Christ candle, with the joyous news of Christ’s resurrection.

But for now, we live into Lent. We live into all the messiness and thorniness of this season – and of our lives. We live in a time when the economy goes from bad to worse; when the unemployment rate continues to go up, and by all counts it will continue to do so; when the tension of our times causes us to flare out in anger toward others, even those we love; when we start to doubt whether the church is up to handling the mess that we bring and transform us into a people called to love.

We don’t need the Lenten Wreath to tell us about that, because we already know all of that. And yet we need to see it, to see the reality of pain that was taken on by God Incarnate. We need to see that because we need to believe in a God who does not deny pain and messiness, but embraces and overcomes it by being fully involved in it. We also need to see the Lenten Wreath with its message that thorns and briars cannot stop the love of God from blessing the world with its truth.

In the month of March, we will have many activities that will be a part of Lent – the sharing of bread and cup at communion, the celebration of the gifts that women bring to Christ’s service, the hearing of the stories of people who reflected on who Jesus was. This is all part of Lent – the movement toward the cross, the movement we mark with the Lenten Wreath.

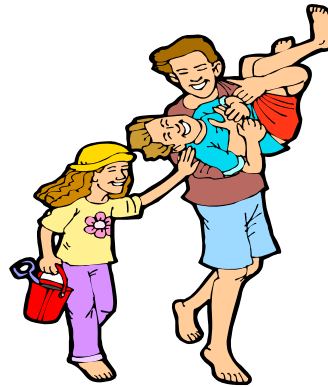
2009 Meaning of Membership Classes

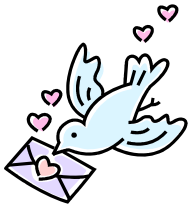
Approved:

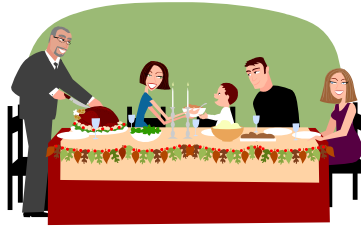

Ligonier Camp

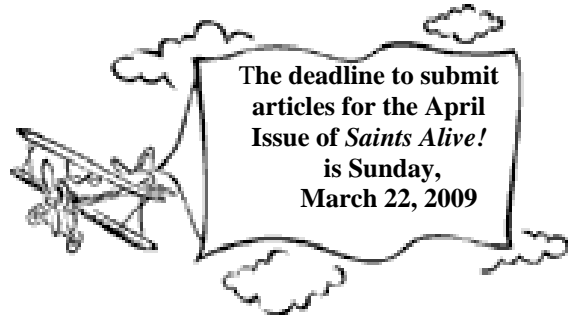
**CHILDREN'S
