## Message from Dr. Bill

It never ceases to amaze me. The calendar is not only consistent—it is relentless as well. The New Year comes whether we are ready for it or not! The pressure of a new year with all its expectations of beginnings, fresh starts, and resolutions is, once again, upon us! We've just managed to survive another hectic holiday season—just now catching our breath from all the decorating, entertaining, traveling, cooking, partying, worshiping, giving, etc., etc.—only to be faced with 365 fresh, new days, each with their own peculiar demands and expectations. (Is it any wonder that so many New Year's Resolutions bite the dust?!) Whew! It makes me tired just to think about it! New Year's Resolutions rarely, if ever, succeed. I think they clearly fall into the category of Unrealistic Expectations. Have you ever noticed the verb we use to describe how we accomplish these resolutions? We MAKE them. We use this word in the same way that we would hear a child say, "You can't MAKE me!" Well...yes we can. We do it all the time. Like reluctant children, we unwillingly drag ourselves into resolutions every year. Weight-loss, exercise, and improved financial planning are but 3 of the most popular items that get selected, especially this year! But like most resolutions, they get quickly forgotten. Sometimes, I've found that people use the New Year to resolve to be better church members. They think, perhaps, that the New Year will bring an opportunity for a fresh start and renewed enthusiasm. Well, insofar as fresh starts and enthusiasm go, that's a great idea! But unfortunately, if "new and improved" church membership is just another resolution, well...you know where that ends up: in the same place as all the others.

I have an idea. What if we don't make resolutions this year? What if, instead we **GIVE PERMISSIONS?**

- Permission to live in the moment
- Permission to laugh (hard and long and loud) at least 3 times a day
- Permission to say "NO" when we're overworked and overextended
- Permission to delegate
- Permission to take a nap
- Permission to take a walk
- Permission to praise someone (even ourselves) for a job well done
- Permission to care for ourselves (Notice how that sounds so much different from a "resolution to exercise"? Sure both may be good for you, but the motivation is totally different—one is caring, the other is a great big "should"!)
- Permission to identify your passion and pursue it. It may be guitar lessons or yoga or mountain climbing or Bible study. It doesn't matter. But if it's something you been putting off until later...well...this is later. It may be cooking or reading or working with numbers or gardening. What turns you on? Is it painting, or crafts or fixing things? Is it making people feel welcomed or caring for someone who's hurt or sick? Is it singing or drama or getting things and people organized? GIVING PERMISSIONS. It sounds much better than MAKING resolutions, doesn't it? "What's the pay-off?" you may ask. It's GRACE! It's acknowledging that God's gift of Jesus to us was not in vain. (After all, God apparently thought we were worth the trip to come here and be Emmanuel—God-With-Us!) It's making Christmas last all yearlong! It's treating each other and ourselves like the beautiful, precious children of God that we are! (By the way, I think I know of a certain church that could grow and thrive and benefit from any or all of these! Imagine what we could do together if we simply gave ourselves permission to...)

## Lorain County Cooperative Ministries

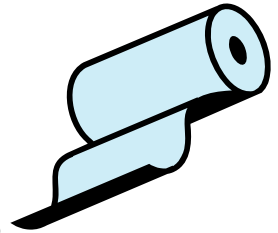

## FINANCIAL REPORT

It is amazing what happens when we put our faith in God. Our budget this year had a little over \$35,000 on the income side for Faith in God. We didn't know where that money would come from but we trusted God to show us how to make it a reality. As in all times when we truly trust in Him, He amazes us. Through November this year, we have collected **\$40,281.35** over our General Fund budget! December will only increase this figure. **Thank you and thanks be to God!** This puts us at an excess of over \$18,000 through November.

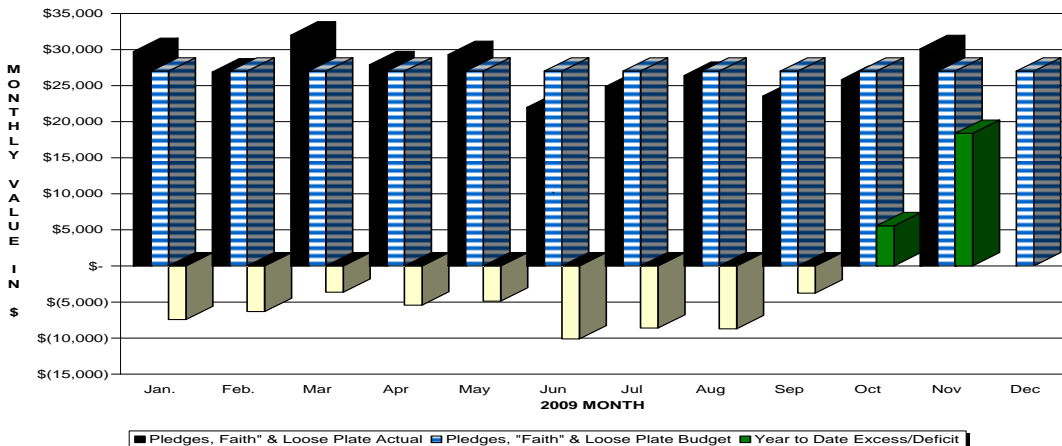
Add to this with \$8,186.00 given at the end of November and more given so far in December we have almost totally paid off the boiler with our "Keep the Flame Burning" campaign.

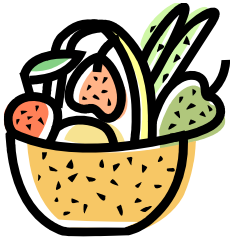

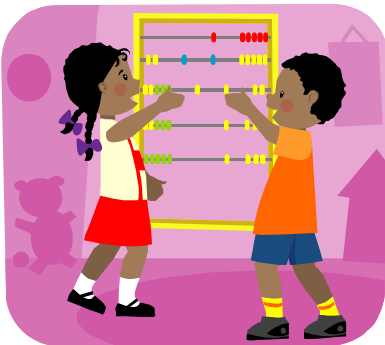


## Cornerstone Preschool Enrolling Now

Please call Nancy Bruder, Director of Cornerstone Preschool, (933-7646) to make an appointment to observe a class prior to registering for the Fall class.

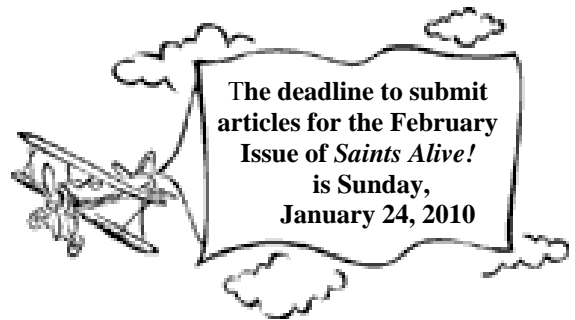

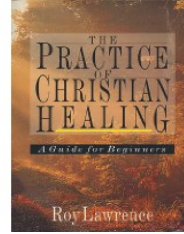

### Adult Sunday School Study

In July 2010, the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) will consider the possibility of adopting the Belhar Confession. This Confession was originally written in response to Apartheid and adopted by the synod of the Dutch Reformed Mission Church in South Africa in 1986. Since then, the Reformed Church in America and the United Church of Christ have adopted the Confession, recognizing that racial injustice continues in the United States.

January 17, 24, February 7, 14, 21 and 28, the Adult Sunday School class will participate in a study (about 6 weeks) of the Belhar Confession, including discussion questions and looking at Biblical references. Any adults are welcome to participate. The class will meet after worship in the Session Room (Room #3).
