This year, Lake Shore United Methodist Church, ALPC and UCC will worship together on Ash Wednesday at Avon Lake United Church of Christ at 7:30 pm to begin the 40 day period of repentance and renewal preceding Easter. Our own Dr. Bill Lindeman will be preaching. There will be a combined choir from all three churches. Please plan to attend this moving service.

Message from Bill

I can hardly believe that Ash Wednesday is upon us already! Seems like I just put the last of the Christmas decorations away!

Lent, the forty-day period that prepares us for the resurrection of Easter, comes early this year. It comes early because the date for Easter is not a calendar date like Christmas (December 25). Easter depends on the cycles of the moon, which aren't exactly the same as the calendar. Easter always comes 6 weeks following the first full moon after the Winter Solstice.

It is our custom to observe the beginning of Lent with a community Ash Wednesday Service. So, plan now to be part of the fellowship and worship as we meet on February 17 at 7:30 pm at the Avon Lake United Church of Christ, 32801 Electric Blvd.

In addition, I sincerely hope you will make Tuesday evening available, starting February 23 and continuing through March 30 for our Lenten Study Series. The Christian Education Ministry is planning studies for all ages. We will begin with dinner at 5:30 and end by 7:30.

For my part of this series, I will be leading a Bible study using The Bible Workbench method, the theme of which is "*Living Our Story Through God's Story*." Now, before you stop reading because you've seen the words "Bible Study," you need to know that this will not be like anything you have ever seen before. Why? Because this journal is NOT the curriculum. YOU will be the curriculum. I have been fortunate enough to be a contributing editor of this journal for about 5 years. My participation in these

groups has transformed my teaching, my preaching, and my understanding of God in my life. You can get additional information at www.bibleworkbench.com.

What makes The Bible Workbench unique is that, unlike so many other Bible studies that are based upon answers and knowledge, The Bible Workbench is based upon questions. It doesn't require you to be a scholar or have any particular knowledge of the Bible. It is a lectionary-based, life-centered biblical resource designed for small-group youth and adult education in church and home, for individual study and as an aid to preachers. One of the lectionary texts is chosen for each Sunday. The exploration begins with a discussion of what is happening in the biblical text. What is going on? The focus then shifts to how this story is happening in the world around us. Finally, the questions turn toward how the story is an event in the lives of the people in the group. Rather than seek a right answer, the journey through the text seeks life giving questions that wait to be lived.

One of my favorite authors has this to say: ***"For both clergy and laity, The Bible Workbench is, in my judgment, the single most important resource for engaging and internalizing the lectionary readings for each Sunday of the year. It is of great value for clergy preparing sermons and for adult study groups undertaking a serious and life-changing encounter with the Bible."***

Please make your plans now to be part of this event. See you Tuesday, February 23 at 5:30 in Hart Hall!

For Children

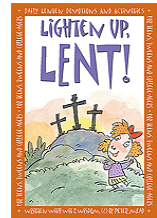

Making Sense of Your Cents

The 2010 Roth IRA Conversion

In case you haven't heard all the buzz, this year marks a one-time Roth IRA conversion event in which people can convert their traditional IRA's, SEP IRA's, Simple IRA's, old 401k's, and old 403b's into a tax free Roth IRA account. Converting means the money will grow tax free, and won't have minimum distribution requirements once you turn 70 1/2. Because of the conversion event, waves of people are expected to take advantage this year and convert their traditional taxable investment accounts into tax free Roth IRA accounts. First though, you'll need to think about whether or not converting them is a good idea for your situation.

Among the things you need to consider:

- **Do I want to pay tax now or later?** Depending on what your tax rate is currently vs. when you retire, your amount of tax can vary quite a bit. The problem is, it can be hard to guess what tax bracket you'll fall into in the future, much less predict if tax rates will go up in the future. (continued on next page)

• **Is my income too high to contribute or convert to a Roth IRA in the future?** If you want to do a bit of tax diversification and your income is currently too high to contribute to a Roth IRA, this year may be one of your few chances to convert your traditional taxable account to a Roth.

Do I want to spread out my tax liability from converting? As part of the conversion event people who convert will be able to spread out their tax liability over 2011 and 2012.

For the right financial situations, this can be a great benefit.

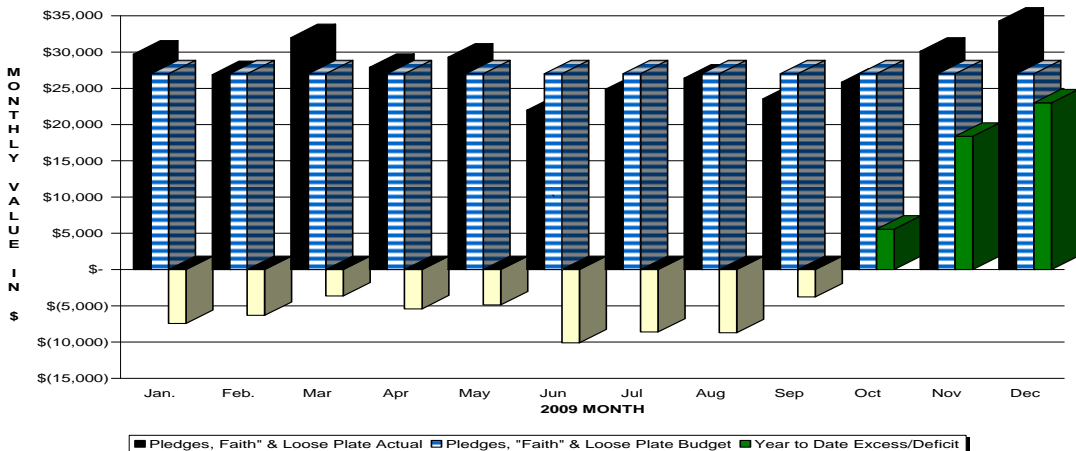
FINANCIAL REPORT

What a year, a terrible economic climate, many of our members losing their jobs or certainly earning less than in the past and a very tight financial budget for the church. Throw in losing a boiler, changing pastors and some other significant expenses and you'd think this would be a very gloomy report. Quite the contrary! We reversed a three year trend of giving below our budget and exceeded our Faith in God portion of the budget by \$13,864 collecting \$51,016 versus our \$37,152 projection. That puts us at a surplus of \$22,846.75 for the year as shown in the chart below. A part of that surplus was also due to the \$8,562 we collected for our Keep the Flame Burning Fund. Thank you and thanks be to God!

For the good news and blessings that God gave us in 2009 we must also be honest and realize that we move into 2010 facing similar challenges. Our pledges are down from where they were starting 2009 in both dollars and families pledging. The majority of our surplus for 2009 was related to the lower expenses of not having a full time pastor for a period of about 3 months. We will again depend on our Faith to get us through 2010. This will be a year of going forward confidently but we must not rely on God to do it **“for”** us. We must be active and realize he will do it **“through”** us. Let's join together in an active faith with our time, talents and treasure.

If you would enjoy working on the finances of the church, I'd like to extend an invitation to join Terry, Marcy, Sharon and myself as a member of the Finance Committee. We are a little different than other committees as we meet every Sunday after church to count the offering. Please stop by the office after the service if you would like to join us. We would love the help.

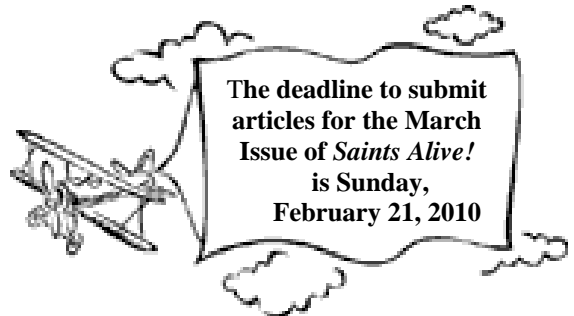

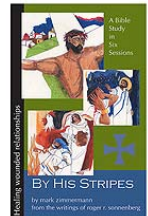
