Message from Bill

From Life's Journeys According to Mr. Rogers, Fred Rogers tells about the cellist, Yo-Yo Ma, and a master class he was holding for young cellists. Fred was visiting the class that day and observing how Yo-Yo Ma was gently leading his students into a deeper understanding about their instruments, their music and even their personal lives—understandings which some said they would take with them for the rest of their lives. After they had been working on a Brahms sonata, Yo-Yo Ma seemed to be looking at one boy in the class when he said these next words, but Fred knew that he was really speaking to everyone when he said:

Nobody else can make the sound you make.

You don't have to play the cello or any other instrument to understand what this means! Nobody else can interpret life the way you can. Nobody else can see what you see or hear what you hear or understand the way you understand. You are unique—a one-of-a-kind creation! God threw away any thought of using a mold because God knew that each creation would be unique—hand-made. And so you are!

Those are strange thoughts for many of us who are used to spending our time cataloguing our shortcomings and inadequacies! But hang in there with me. It will be worth it.

I'm sure Paul was thinking about the same thing when he wrote to the Corinthians, saying "... the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose." (Selections from I Corinthians 12)

Whether here in the church, or in our schools, or in our families, whenever or wherever we happen to be, remember this:

- You are a beautiful and precious child of God
- There is no part of you that God is not madly in love with
- There has never been anyone like you in the history of the world
- There will never be anyone like you ever again
- You and your life are EXACTLY on time (because it is never too late to be awake and alive in this present moment where God is.)
- Life is short. Stay awake for it. Breathe.
You already have everything you need to be happy (Just let go of what you don't need so you can receive it)



Starting today, begin each and every morning with this list. Turn the pronouns around and say them to yourself, first thing every day:

- I am a beautiful and precious child of God
- There is no part of me that God is not madly in love with
- There has never been anyone like me in the history of the world
- There will never be anyone like me ever again
- Me and my life are EXACTLY on time
- Life is short. I am awake for it. I am breathing.
- I already have everything I need to be happy (I am letting go of what I don't need so I can receive it.)

You can do this because *nobody can make the sound you make*. That is your reality. That is your present. That is your future. Now... imagine what an entire community of faith could accomplish.

What is the sound that no one else can make that you hear Avon Lake Presbyterian Church making?

Our Church Finances

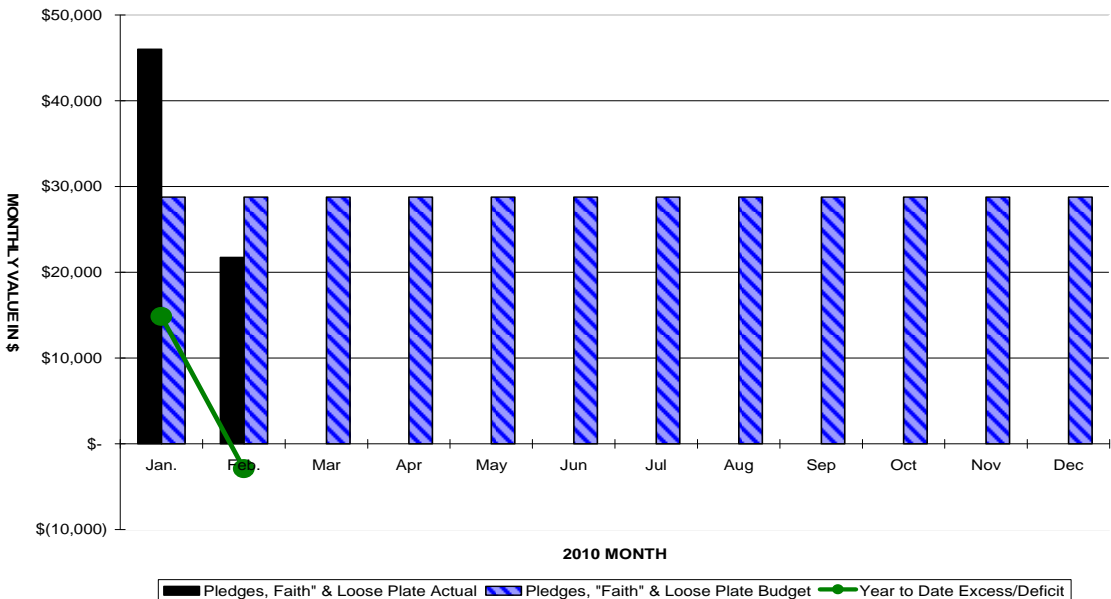
February ended with our church moving into the red. We have a year to date deficit of just over \$2,900. This is a result of giving being substantially below the budget for the month coupled with over \$10,000 in expenses for the project to separate the rain water from our sewer lines for the older portion of the building. We obviously need to bring our giving back up. These expenses though budgeted do hit us early in the year versus being paid out evenly over the year.

We've collected \$4,445.68 in Per Capita offerings through the end of February. We haven't hit our goal of at least \$5,500 but we continue to move in the right direction. As a reminder, the bill to our church is \$21.29 for each member. If you have not contributed to the Per Capita offering, you can just make a check out to the church and mark it, "Per Capita," in the memo line.

If you would enjoy working on finances of the church I'd like to extend an invitation to join Terry, Marcy, Sharon and myself as a member of the Finance Committee. We are a little different than other committees as we meet every Sunday after church to count the offering. Please stop by the office after the service if you would like to join us. We would love the help.

“Random Acts of Kindness”



Stewardship is all about using our lives to bring the Kingdom of God here on earth – *“Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.”* (Matthew 6:10).

This Easter season, we will be encouraging each other to be intentional about doing just that through random acts of kindness. On Easter Sunday, April 4th, we will be kicking off a seven week program to encourage all of us to be more deliberate about the ways in which we bless one another. There will be a form in every bulletin for those of you who wish to participate. During

the following week you are asked to write down the random acts of kindness you extend to others throughout the course of that week. The following Sunday you will put your form in the offering plate. There will also be a glass fish bowl in the front of the sanctuary with baskets of colored glass gems. During the second hymn you will be invited to put as many glass gems in the bowl as random acts of kindness that you recorded on your form. If you do not feel comfortable going up during the hymn, you may fill the fish bowl before or after the worship service. We do not want you to put your name on the form but we do hope you write legibly as we would like to type up all the acts of kindness and put them on the back of the form for the following Sunday to share with each other the many different ways we can show God’s love and serve one another.

It has been written that it takes 21 days to break a habit or establish a new habit. We all intend to be a blessing each and every day but many days are so full of activity we miss out on daily opportunities. From Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday there are 49 days. If we spend each one of those days intentionally focused on taking advantage of new opportunities we hope to establish new habits. It could be a great opportunity to be creative and break out of our comfort zones.

In Mark 1:17, Jesus tells us to follow him and he will make us fishers of men. What better way to “catch” men (and women of course) than by serving them with random acts of kindness. Let’s fill up our fish bowl with glass gems instead of fish and be the fishers of men Jesus called us to be.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

Regular Session Meeting—March 15, 2010

The Elders of Session

Learned that:

- 149 persons received communion in worship on March 7, and 2 persons received communion at home.
- Communion will be offered on Maundy Thursday as part of the Tenebrae Service.
- One Great Hour of Sharing, with its Hunger, Disaster Assistance, and Self Development of People emphases will take place on Palm Sunday, March 28, 2010.
- The *Easter Offering* envelope in your monthly packet is for a “Local” offering, with 50% of your gifts going to Community Resource Services (CRS) and 50% going to the Lorain Cooperative Ministries.
- The separation of the sanitary and storm sewer lines is very near completion.
- A Master Coding System is being put together so that we can track our members’ involvement in the ministries of our church and use that data base for volunteer recruitment.

Approved:

- The next Meaning of Membership (MOM) classes being scheduled for April 11, 18, 25, and May 2.
- An Elder Representative attending the Deacons’ Meeting each month just as a Deacon Representative attends Session Meeting monthly, both for the purpose of better communication between our two boards.

Heard:

- The next Ingathering of 2-Cents-A-Meal will be on April 25, 2010.
- A new structure is being considered for the spring MOM class, along with a Mentoring Program to help guide and support the class members as they grow in their discipleship and merge into the life of ALPC.
- There will be two services on Easter Sunday---9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.---with the Deacons’ Breakfast served between services.
- One service will resume with The Elders of Jazz worship service at 10:00 a.m. on April 11.

Interim Update



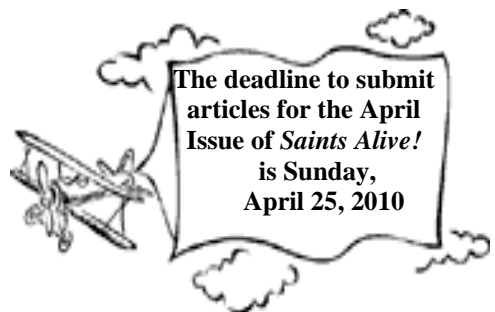
Beulah Beach Annual Retreat 2010
